Notes on Use

K.S.A. 38-1565, no longer in effect, required a court services officer or the secretary (if the child was in the secretary's custody) to submit a report to the court of the progress being made toward the goals of the permanency plan, at least every six months. Although no longer the law, this is still considered the best practice, and is the written policy of the secretary. Every six months, or at times deemed appropriate, the court may set the case for a review hearing. It should be noted, however, that if the court determines at a review hearing that reintegration may not be a viable alternative for the

child, a permanency hearing shall be held no later than 30 days following that determination. K.S.A. 38-2264(e).
