**ORDER TERMINATING JURISDICTION - JO**

Pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2304

On this date, \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_\_, the Court finds that jurisdiction over the juvenile named above shall be terminated for the following reason:

- the complaint has been dismissed
- the juvenile named above has been adjudicated not guilty of the charges filed herein
- the juvenile named above has successfully completed the sentence in this case
- the juvenile named above has not successfully completed the sentence but the Court finds that further use of court resources in this case is not warranted
- the juvenile named above has been discharged by the commissioner pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2376, and amendments thereto
- the juvenile named above has attained the age of 21 years and no exceptions apply that extend jurisdiction beyond age 21
- the juvenile named above has been convicted of a new felony while incarcerated in a juvenile correctional facility for an offense, which if committed by an adult would constitute the commission of a felony
- the juvenile has attained the age of 23 years

It is therefore ordered that the jurisdiction of this Court shall cease upon the filing of this order.

## Notes on Use

The statute provides the circumstances under which jurisdiction shall cease. These include the attainment of the age of 21 years, if no exceptions apply that extend jurisdiction beyond that age. There are 2 exceptions that may extend jurisdiction beyond the age of 21 years:

1. the juvenile was sentenced accordingly pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2369
2. the juvenile was sentenced under extended jurisdiction juvenile prosecution, pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2347.

Regardless of the exception, juvenile jurisdiction shall not continue after the juvenile's 23<sup>rd</sup> birthday.
