## FOREWORD

---

In accordance with precedence, the Honorable William M. Ferguson, President of the Bar Association of the State of Kansas, has been asked to prepare an article on the subject of his choosing for publication in this issue of the BULLETIN. He has done so and we believe his article on "Revision of the Criminal Code" will be of particular interest to attorneys throughout the state.

William M. Ferguson was born and reared in Wellington, Kansas. He is now 45 years of age. He graduated from the Wellington Public Schools in 1934, receiving an A. B. from the University of Kansas in 1938, and an LL. B. from the Harvard Law School in 1941. He is a member of Sigma Alpha Epsilon social fraternity, and is an honorary member of the Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity.

He is now serving his second term as Attorney General of Kansas. Prior to taking office as Attorney General, he had been active in the practice of law since 1941, except for service as a naval officer from August, 1942, to his discharge in December, 1945, as a lieutenant senior grade.

He served as City Attorney for the City of Wellington from 1948 to 1957, and four terms in the State House of Representatives, beginning in 1949. He was a member of the Legislative Council and Chairman of the House Welfare Committee. During his legislative career he took particular interest in the development of the Kansas mental health program.

Mr. Ferguson served as the Kansas Bar Association delegate to the House of Delegates of the American Bar in 1960-61. He has been a member of the Executive Council of the Kansas Bar since 1952.

He is a rancher and cattleman with a ranch in Cowley and Elk Counties. He is the non-active President of the Security State Bank in Wellington. His hobbies include hunting, fishing and skiing, and he is a licensed pilot with an instrument rating. He is a member of the Presbyterian Church.

He was married in September of 1939 to the former Harriet Sheldon of Kansas City, Missouri. They live at 123 Danbury Lane, Topeka, Kansas, and they have retained their home at 1023 South Washington in Wellington. They have two children, Joan, 20, and William M. III, 15.

This issue of the BULLETIN also contains summarized tables showing the volume of work in the Supreme Court, the district courts, probate courts, county and city courts of the state for the year ending June 30, 1963.

The Honorable Jay S. Parker, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, pursuant to authority vested in him by G. S. 1949, 20-2201, appointed the Honorable Alfred G. Schroeder of Topeka, a Justice of the Supreme Court, for a term of four years beginning July 1, 1963, to membership on the Judicial Council succeeding the Honorable Robert T. Price. James D. Waugh, a lawyer in



Topeka, was also appointed as a new member of the Council to serve the unexpired term of Walter G. Thiele, who resigned, such term to commence July 1, 1963. The Honorable Doyle E. White of Winfield, J. Willard Haynes of Kansas City, and Robert H. Cobean of Wellington were reappointed for a term of four years beginning July 1, 1963.

At its reorganizational meeting on July 2, 1963, the Council elected the Honorable Alfred G. Schroeder as its Chairman and James D. Waugh as its Secretary.

Following adoption of the new Code of Civil Procedure by the Legislature, to take effect January 1, 1964, the Judicial Council at its meeting on April 25, 1963, authorized the existing committee, which worked on revision of the Civil Code, to prepare and submit to the Supreme Court for consideration and adoption proposed "Rules pertaining to the record on appeal" and other rules made necessary by the new Code of Civil Procedure.

Pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution No. 43 the Judicial Council at its meeting on July 2, 1963, appointed five lawyers and Mr. Dan Hopson, Jr. of Lawrence, reporter, to make a study, report and recommendations of and pertaining to the provisions of the Kansas probate code and other laws relating to the voluntary hospitalization, emergency and other involuntary commitment and admission of persons to mental hospitals, the guardianship of the person and property of incompetents including the mentally ill, chronically physically ill, and the conservation of the estates of such persons.

Mr. Robert H. Cobean of Wellington is Chairman of this committee in his capacity as a member of the Judicial Council. The other members of this Advisory Committee are the Honorable Joe H. Swinehart of Kansas City, Roy Kirby of Coffeyville, Marvin E. Thompson of Russell, Raymond Briman of Topeka, and Donald L. Burnett of Larned.

The initial meeting of the foregoing committee was held at the Statehouse in Topeka on July 27, 1963.

---

Another Advisory Committee was appointed by the Judicial Council at its meeting on July 2, 1963, for the purpose of drafting a recodification of the Criminal Code (Chapters 21 and 62) under the direction of the Honorable Doyle E. White of Winfield as Chairman in his capacity as a member of the Judicial Council. Mr. Paul E. Wilson of Lawrence was appointed to be the reporter on this committee. The lawyers appointed to this committee are Lester M. Goodell of Topeka, Howard E. Payne of Olathe, E. Lael Alkire of Wichita, Selby S. Soward of Goodland, and A. K. Stavely of Topeka.

The initial meeting of the foregoing committee was held at the Statehouse in Topeka on August 28, 1963.

## Revision of the Criminal Code

It is one of the primary functions of the Kansas Bar Association to encourage and support improvement in Kansas laws and procedure. During the 1963 session of the legislature the Bar concentrated its efforts on the passage of the new Code of Civil Procedure, which was so ably drafted by the Judicial Council Committee. That Code has been adopted and the State Bar, through its committee on Continuing Legal Education, has conducted two and has arranged for three more seminars in order to acquaint the lawyers of Kansas with its scope and contents.

The Kansas Criminal Code is more antiquated and in greater need of updating than was the Civil Code. Much of it has remained unchanged since its passage by the 1855 Territorial Legislature. There has been no general overhauling of the Criminal Code since its enactment.

Any prosecutor will attest to the fact that the sections on manslaughter are irreconcilable. Serious conflicts exist with respect to the present Criminal Code and the Juvenile Code. Misdemeanors are scattered throughout the General Statutes and Supplement and recent U. S. Supreme Court decisions have revealed areas of serious deficiency in our existing criminal procedure. Our provisions relating to arrest and bail are antiquated, and our scale of punishments should be re-examined in the light of modern penology. For more than a hundred years we have been amending and adding to the criminal law and procedure on a piecemeal basis—we need now to re-evaluate it in its entirety.

The legislature and the Judicial Council have recognized the problem. The 1963 Legislature directed that a revision of the Criminal Code be undertaken by the Judicial Council, and appropriated \$15,000, a part of which is to be used to finance the revision.

This work, expected to take at least three years, involves revision of both Chapter 21, on crimes and punishments, and Chapter 62, on criminal procedure, of the General Statutes of Kansas.

As of this date, an Advisory Committee of the Kansas Judicial Council—a committee balanced between prosecution and defense—has held two meetings preparatory to beginning work.

The chairman of the Kansas Bar Association's Criminal Law Committee has alerted the members of his committee that they will be asked to cooperate where possible in the criminal law codification.

The non-lawyer members of the House and Senate voted for the revision of the Civil Code largely because of the support given the revision by the bench and bar in their districts. Lawyers and judges should begin now to acquaint themselves with the necessity of revamping the Criminal Code. It should be considered a major project of the Kansas Bar Association.

## Summary of the Work of the Supreme Court

The following is a summary of the work of the Supreme Court for the year ending June 30, 1963, and the cases pending July 1, 1963.

The Supreme Court disposed of 506 cases during the year, an increase of 102 cases over the average for the preceding ten years. Included in the total disposed of by the court, were 391 appealed civil cases, 82 appealed criminal cases and 33 were original cases.

Of the total civil appeals, 117 were affirmed, 57 reversed, 211 dismissed, 5 affirmed in part and reversed in part, and 1 was affirmed as modified.

Of the appealed criminal cases, 31 were affirmed, 3 reversed, and 48 dismissed.

Judgment was for the plaintiff in 1 original case and for the defendant in 21 others. The court dismissed 11 original cases.

The Supreme Court also issued 788 orders prior to final disposition of cases pending during the year and in addition ruled upon 89 post-decision motions.

Pending in the Supreme Court as of July 1, 1963, were 362 cases of which 311 were appealed civil cases, 43 appealed criminal cases and 8 original cases. The average number of cases pending on July 1 for the past ten years is 300.

During the year ending July 1, 1963, opinions were filed in 258 cases. In 225 cases opinions were filed on the first regular opinion day; in 16 cases on the second regular opinion day; in 1 case on the third regular opinion day; and 1 on the eighth regular opinion day. Fifteen cases were decided on the day they were submitted.

The regular opinion day is ordinarily a month after the case is submitted, more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In the 195 appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1963, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: within 3 to 4 months 6 cases; in 4 to 6 months 16 cases; in 6 to 8 months 25 cases; in 8 to 10 months 45 cases; in 10 to 12 months 66 cases; and over 12 months 37 cases.

In the 41 appealed criminal cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1963, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: within 4 to 5 months 7 cases; in 5 to 7 months 11 cases; in 7 to 9 months 9 cases; in 9 to 12 months 9 cases; and over 12 months 5 cases.

In the 36 years the clerk of the Supreme Court has furnished us detailed information of the work of the court, it has disposed of 15,615 cases, of which 5,336 were dismissed before submission, and 10,279 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
