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Foreword

This issue of the BULLETIN contains a list of court days for 1969 in the various district courts of the state of Kansas in accordance with the judicial redistricting of the state by the 1968 session of the legislature.

A brief summary of the activities and accomplishments of the Kansas Judicial Council for the past year will follow.

Since 1963 the Judicial Council, with the assistance of an advisory committee, has been working on recodification of the criminal code. In April, 1968, the Council issued a special BULLETIN publishing the proposed Kansas criminal code. The proposed criminal code submitted in this special report is confined to the substantive provisions of the criminal law. The Council and its advisory committee are continuing its work on criminal procedure which will be released in a special BULLETIN when the work is complete. Legislative committees are presently working on the proposed criminal code submitted in the special report, and in all probability it will be introduced in the 1969 session of the legislature. The work on criminal procedure, however, will not be ready for submission to the 1969 session of the legislature.

At the request of the legal ethics committee of the State Bar Association the Council in the year 1965 undertook a study of the procedure in handling grievances for lawyers' violations of the Canons of Legal Ethics and the procedure for disciplinary action to be taken in such cases. In the month of May, 1967, the Council concluded its work on this matter and submitted its work to the Supreme Court for action. The Supreme Court after working on the matter with the Board of Law Examiners modified the report submitted by the Council and adopted rules relating to the admission, discipline and disbarment of attorneys, effective May 21, 1968, which presently appear in the Rules of the Supreme Court of Kansas as published on October 1, 1968.

The civil code advisory committee, rejuvenated in 1967 for the purpose of studying rules in connection with a new code of civil procedure, continued to make recommendations to the Council for the adoption of new rules by the Supreme Court. The Council, after acting upon these rules, submitted them to the Supreme Court and those adopted by the Supreme Court appear in the Rules of the Supreme Court of Kansas published October 1, 1968.

Projects referred to the Judicial Council by the 1967 session of the legislature have been disposed as follows:

(a) Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 25 directing the Council to make a study relating to judicial redistricting and reapportionment was completed and the Council's report submitted to the 1968 session of the legislature. The legislature, after making several amendments, enacted legislation submitted by the Council redistricting the judicial districts of the state of Kansas. The substance of this legislation appears in summary form in Rule No. 122 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of Kansas published October 1, 1968, wherein the terms of court in each county of the judicial districts of the state of Kansas as defined by the Laws of 1968, chapter 385, are indicated.

(b) House Concurrent Resolution No. 1008 directing the Council to make a study of the feasibility of establishing a "Hall of Courts" and constructing and equipping a building or buildings for this and other related purposes, in-

cluding the state law library, etc., was concluded by the Council early in the year 1968, and its report submitted to the legislature. Briefly summarized, this report found it feasible and recommends the establishment of a new Supreme Court building in the area south of the State Capitol (presently under study for acquisition by the state) to house the Supreme Court, the state law library, and other court-related agencies presently located in the State Capitol building.

(c) House Concurrent Resolution No. 1027 requesting the Council to make a study of the adequacies of the law providing for the selection, summoning and procedures of grand juries, is presently under study by the criminal recodification advisory committee and the Council in connection with the drafting of a code of criminal procedure.

Statistics relating to the work of the courts in the state of Kansas were gathered and published in the October issue of the Kansas Judicial Council BULLETIN disclosing the state of business for the courts in Kansas ending June 30, 1968.

- Div. No. 1, First Thursday of each month.
- Div. No. 2, None.
- Div. No. 3, First Friday of each month.
- Div. No. 4, Second Thursday of each month.
- Div. No. 5, Second Friday of each month.
- Div. No. 6, Third Thursday of each month.
- Div. No. 7, Third Friday of each month.

All post-trial motions and motions in criminal matters are heard at 2:00 p. m. on the day of the respective divisions' domestic motions.

NOTE 9. In Marshall County, opening day of the September term of court delayed one day a/c Labor Day. In addition to the regular days of court in Division No. 1, in Riley County, time permitting, special days of court will be held on the third Friday of the month. Also, special days of court in Divisions No. 1 and No. 2 will be scheduled in Clay, Marshall and Riley Counties as the need arises.

NOTE 10. In Reno County, July 4, 11, 18, 25, and August 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29, are court days.

NOTE 11. In Wyandotte County, pretrial and post-trial motions in divorce cases are heard every Friday in the division to which the case is assigned, except that any motion requiring presentation of oral evidence will be specially set by the judge. All other motions are heard in the division to which the case is assigned on the dates indicated above. All motions in criminal cases are heard by the judge in charge of the criminal court by arrangement with him. The criminal court rotates among the various divisions. No regular motion days are designated during the months of July and August, however, each judge will hear his motions at such times as will be fixed by him. All pretrial motions in divorce cases and emergency matters will be heard each Friday by the judge on duty during these months. All attorneys of record are notified of settings by the assignment clerk.

Italicized dates indicate the first day of the regular terms of court—
a. 9:00 a. m.; b. 9:30 a. m.; c. 10:00 a. m.; d. 10:30 a. m.; e. 11:00 a. m.;
f. 1:00 p. m.; g. 1:30 p. m.; h. 2:00 p. m.

NOTE 1. See Rule No. 113 of the Supreme Court, relating to District Courts.

NOTE 2. In Shawnee County the schedule continues through July and August, as follows:

- Div. No. 1, July 11 and August 8,
- Div. No. 2, July 18 and August 15,
- Div. No. 3, July 25 and August 22.
- Div. No. 4, July 4 and August 1 and 29.

NOTE 3. In Bourbon County, July 16 is court day. In Linn County, July 14 is opening day of court term. In Miami County, July 15 is court day. Court convenes at 10:00 a. m. for trials to the court and 9:00 a. m. for jury trials.

NOTE 4. In Douglas County all court days open at 9:30 a. m.; and July 11 and August 1 are court days, opening at 9:30 a. m. On days on which a term of court opens, the civil docket will be called beginning at 9:30 a. m. and the criminal docket will be called beginning at 2:00 p. m.

NOTE 5. In Dickinson County there is no jury at May term of court; and in Morris and Geary Counties, there is no jury at June terms, except on special order.

NOTE 6. In Harvey County, there are court days July 10 and 24, and August 7. In McPherson County, court days are July 11 and 25, and August 1. Court begins at 9:30 on these days.

NOTE 7. In Crawford County, July 11 is court day in the Girard Division, and July 7 is court day in the Pittsburg Division.

NOTE 8. In Sedgwick County, all pre-trial motions in civil cases other than divorce are heard by the Administrative Judge on Friday morning at 9:30 a. m., of the week following the filing of the motion.
