FOREWORD

The Honorable Philip H. Lewis, President of the Kansas Bar Association, has been requested to prepare an article on a subject of his choosing for publication in this issue of the COUNCIL BULLETIN. He has done so, and we believe his article is timely and should command the attention of the attorneys throughout the state. It is entitled "Law and the Lawyer."

Philip H. Lewis of Topeka, Kansas, attended Washburn University and was admitted to the Kansas Bar in 1935. He is a partner in the firm of Eidson, Lewis, Porter & Haynes. He has been a lecturer at Washburn Law School, and was on the National Board of Governors for the Red Cross from 1956 to 1959. He has been on the Board of Regents at Washburn University from 1964 to 1969, and served as its Chairman from 1969 to 1971. In 1967 he was a State Delegate to the American Bar Association; Chairman of the Junior Bar Conference from 1941 to 1942; Assembly Delegate from 1942 to 1943; on the World Peace Through Law Committee from 1958 to 1966; and in the Section of General Practice, Council, from 1962 to 1965, and Chairman from 1965 to 1966. He has been on the World Order Under Law Committee since 1969; and the Advisory Committee, Standing Committee on Federal Legislation since 1958.

As a member of the Kansas Bar Association Mr. Lewis was on the Executive Council from 1964 to 1969; Vice President, 1969 to 1970; President-Elect, 1970 to 1971; and President, 1971 to 1972. Since 1956 he has been on the Executive Council of the Topeka Bar Association and was President in 1954-1955. He is a Fellow of the American Bar Foundation.

This issue of the BULLETIN also contains summarized tables showing the volume of work in the Supreme Court, the district courts, probate courts, county and city courts of the state for the year ending June 30, 1971.

Law and the Lawyer

Assuming the responsibility of heading the Kansas Bar Association does not add to one's knowledge of the law nor does it make him more legally astute. It does tend to recast the professional prospective. Day to day involvement with legal specifics, inherent in law practice, must be broadened to encompass the functioning of the legal profession as part of the statewide legal system. A natural sequence is enlarged philosophical inquiry as to purpose of Law and the role of the lawyer.

When the average person is required to cast an image of the lawyer, the tendency is to do so in the form of the advocate for a particular client. The profession's view is not to different except that professional understanding of varied legal functions will include the image of advocacy beyond the courtroom scene. Most of the profession's heroes have been outstanding advocates of the causes which they championed. Clinical presentations of trial advocacy are a perennial favorite in legal institutes. Requirements for vastly increased legal representation in criminal matters has given great impetus in this direction. For a number of years, the American Trial Lawyers Association, the American College of Trial Lawyers, and many organizations of plaintiff and defense lawyers have given increased emphasis toward increasing the effectiveness of advocacy of clients' causes. Within the past two years, the American Bar Association has effectively pushed the establishment of a national school for advocacy designed to improve advocacy techniques.

It is not the purpose of this dissertation to decry those efforts. The writer has shared with other lawyers the desire to improve his personal performance in advocacy and to aid in furthering the effectiveness of the profession in this vital role. However, it is equally important to place in perspective the advocacy of the client's cause with the broad purpose of Law and the role of the lawyer in the fulfilling of that purpose. It is toward this perspective that these comments are directed.

We become accustomed to contemplate law and laws in specifics. Through the years, we have devolved such a body of statutory laws and judicial decisions that in day to day practice we concern ourselves with particular statutes and/or decided cases that are directly involved with the issue or cause demanding our attention. Most dictionaries offer a variety of definitions of the law—each peculiarly relevant to specific applications of developed law. Similarly, the lawyer is traditionally identified with the furtherance of his client's cause. We seldom pause to consider the fundamental purpose of Law as distinguished from the thrust of particular statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, and decisions.

Courtroom disruptions, in recent years, abetted by advocacy excesses should make all of us give thought to fundamentals. It is submitted that Law, in its broad and basic sense, is the framework created to enable people to live together in an orderly and harmonious society. The extensiveness of its verbalization and institutional complexity relates to the size and complexity of the society it serves. Realistically, we must recognize that many of our past and present statutory enactments were and are directed toward selfish objectives of some segment of society. This practical fact must not blind us to the basic

and fundamental purpose of Law. One of the functions of the legal profession, along with all citizens and particularly persons having legislative responsibilities, should be a continuous evaluation of our laws to eliminate unfairness and to make them conducive to the promotion of an orderly and harmonious functioning of our society.

Day to day attention to client-oriented functioning must not cause us to lose sight of our basic responsibility for the furtherance of the purpose of our system of Law. Without minimizing the propriety of the adversary system in the settling of disputes, there must be balance between advocacy of a client's cause and the need of society to have Law contribute toward the ability of people to live together with as little friction as possible. This is not to suggest that rights should be weakly surrendered. In the long pull, such surrender can build tension and future conflict. It does mean that we, as a profession, owe a higher responsibility to the total society to seek reconciliation and accommodation of sincere and conflicting points of view. It is at that place our professional service sometimes does not attain the heights toward which we should always strive. Our devotion to individual advocacy often clouds our perspective.

Some of the untoward excesses of advocacy, recently observed and generally lamented by courts and lawyers, may well have their psychological roots in the commitment of profession to the devoted advocacy of the causes of our clients and the absence of enunciation of our higher professional responsibility toward society as a whole. The line between advocacy and serving as a legal mouthpiece for a client or clients is narrow and often subtle. The vast majority of lawyers in this state adhere to this line. However, such adherence is seldom based upon an articulation of principles or guidelines. It is more often based upon experience, a desire for intra-professional respect, and an unconscious realization of the role of the lawyers discussed herein. It is herein suggested that more affirmative expression of our greater professional role is timely and important.

We have been fortunate in this state that lawyers have sought to resolve differences between our clients. We usually seek to inject objectivity into disputes. The more mutual respect which we have within our profession, the better we function in this regard. Whenever we think about it, we all recognize that our legal system cannot function if every controversy is carried to terminal litigation. This becomes increasingly true as population and institutions multiply. That this break-down does not occur is evidence that lawyers do in fact seek to reconcile differences between their clients. One oft-overlooked but important function of the lawyer is to bring objectivity to his own client as well as to the opposing client through his lawyer. Our function is to aid society to avoid disputes and to resolve them when differences and disputes do occur.

Whenever court congestion is discussed, and inherent question is whether the members of the legal profession in the congested jurisdiction have so committed themselves to advocacy as to have forgotten the responsibility of the profession toward the total society. It is not suggested that this over-simplification is the primary or predominant cause. It is only suggested that this is one area in which the profession can constructively contribute to an easing of the problem when and where it exists. It is noted in passing that this problem

is currently and peculiarly noticeable in the field of criminal law, a situation which must and will be balanced in the maturity of time.

Part of the stimulus for this article came from a talk to a law school class on the broad subject of the legal profession. One of the points made was the importance of the legal profession serving society in the accommodation and reconciliation of conflicting points of view. Extensive dialogue was not needed for it to be apparent that such an observation was startling to many of the prospective lawyers in attendance. It was too much at variance with the concept of militant advocacy with which they were imbued or becoming imbued, perhaps encouraged by much publicized courtroom performances, speeches, and writings of proponents of such type of advocacy. This suggested to the writer that the legal profession should more affirmatively clarify and articulate its higher role and function and the fundamental purpose of Law. Unless it does, the courts, the practicing bar, and society will suffer.

Summary of the Work of the Supreme Court

The following is a summary of the work of the Supreme Court for the year ending June 30, 1971, and the cases pending July 1, 1971.

The Supreme Court disposed of 321 cases during the year. Included in the total terminated by the Court were 192 appealed civil cases, 85 appealed criminal cases and 44 original cases.

Of the total civil appeals, 115 were affirmed, 45 were reversed, 25 dismissed, 6 affirmed in part and reversed in part, and 1 remanded.

Of the appealed criminal cases, 58 were affirmed, 10 were reversed, 16 dismissed, and 1 affirmed in part and reversed in part.

Of 44 original cases, the Court dismissed 8 cases, entered judgment for plaintiff in 3 cases and for defendant in 33 cases.

The Supreme Court also issued 935 orders prior to final disposition of cases pending during the year and in addition ruled upon 57 post-decision motions.

During the year 23 appeals were also docketed in the Supreme Court under Rule No. 6 (*j*). In such cases, 11 applications for intermediate orders were granted, and 12 were denied. In 10 cases, the regular appeal was docketed and in 13 cases the appeal was either pending or terminated in the district court by the end of the fiscal year.

There were 13 applications for permission to take interlocutory appeals (Rule 5) filed in the Supreme Court, 9 of which were denied, and 4 allowed. Four applications for permission to take an interlocutory appeal in criminal cases (Rule 17) were filed. Two were granted and two were denied.

Pending in the Supreme Court as of July 1, 1971, were 329 cases, of which 241 were appealed civil cases, 72 appealed criminal cases and 16 original cases. The average number of cases pending on July 1, for the past ten years is 315.

During the year ending June 30, 1971, opinions were filed in 275 cases terminated by the Court. In 239 cases opinions were filed on or before the first regular opinion day; in 5 cases on or before the second regular opinion day; and in 3 cases on or before the third regular opinion day. Twenty-eight cases were decided on the day they were submitted.

The regular opinion day is ordinarily a month after the case is submitted, more accurately it is the Saturday of the week hearings are had the next month after the case is submitted.

In 170 appealed civil cases in which opinions were filed within the year ending June 30, 1971, the time between the day the case was docketed in this Court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: Within three months, 4 cases; in three to four months, 1 case; in four to six months, 15 cases; in six to eight months, 11 cases; in eight to ten months, 9 cases; in ten to twelve months, 23 cases; and in over twelve months, 107 cases.

In 69 appealed criminal cases in which opinions were filed during the year ending June 30, 1971, the time between the date notice of appeal was filed in this Court and the date the case was submitted on its merits was as follows: Within three months, no cases; in three to four months, no cases; in four to six months, 1 case; in six to eight months, 6 cases; in eight to ten months, 6 cases; in ten to twelve months, 10 cases; and in over twelve months, 46 cases.

In the forty-four years that the Clerk of the Supreme Court has furnished us detailed information of the work of the Supreme Court, it has disposed of 18,303 cases, of which 5,901 were dismissed before submission, and 12,402 were submitted on the merits and written opinions filed.
